

## MATERIALS LIST FOR GEOLOGIC ABSTRACTS

**Golden Fluid Acrylic paints and mediums**— Do a Google search for "Golden Paints" to see many sources. Michaels and Hobby Lobby craft stores have limited selections. Larger art stores, or online art stores (dickblick.com and jerrysartarama.com) have a complete selection of colors and mediums.

**Gel Medium** – I use Golden's regular gel. Excellent adhesive

**Gloss Medium** – I use Golden's Gloss Medium. You may prefer Matte Medium or Semi-Gloss Medium for a less shiny finish. I use Gloss Medium as a final isolation coat. You may want to put an additional coat of varnish on the painting. Can also be used to dilute Golden Fluid Acrylic paints.

**Liquitex Soluvar** is the varnish I sometimes use. It is very stinky and not water soluble so clean up is with turpenoid. It is self-leveling and has UV filters.

Alex Flex Flexible Spackling, Premixed Stucco Patch (both DAP products) and Mapei Type 1 Tile Adhesive – available at big box hardware stores such as Home Depot and Lowes in the paint section and the tile section.

**Wood Panels** and **Stretched Canvas**—I mostly buy painting surfaces from online stores: Dickblick.com or jerrysartarama.com. They offer bulk discounts, have frequent sales, and often have free shipping with larger orders.

Canson XL Mix Media paper – Often on sale at Michaels craft stores - buy one/get one free. I buy the 98 lb (160 g) paper tablets in various sizes.

**Brushes** – I like to buy short handled synthetic or nylon brushes, suitable for watercolor or acrylics. The sizes I use most often are a ¾ inch flat, a #6 round, and a fine detail brush – about a #2. Larger brushes are required for larger works. I clean them with soap and water or there are several brands of brush cleaners.

**Polyform Model Air Clay** – Michaels, Hobby Lobby, Walmart Super Stores with a craft section.

**Materials for clay impressions** – Michaels in the polymer clay section, or cake decorating section. You can also use buttons, cabinet door pulls or any item with a pattern that can be pressed into the clay. See also Artistic Renderings shop on Etsy.com for clay texture stamps.

**Pebbles, stones, shells, other decorative fillers** – Michaels, often in the silk flower arranging section

**Microbeads** – by Recollections – Michaels in the scrapbooking section.
