Now its Time to Publish Your Journal

- 1. Choose your publishing company name.
- 2. Get an ISBN number and ISBN bar code for your journal.
 - Post ISBN number to your copyright page.
 - Add your bar code to the back of your book cover.
- 3. Publish your journal.
 - Adjust spine width & create a print-ready PDF of book cover.
 - $\boldsymbol{-}$ Create a print-ready PDF of your manuscript.
- 4. Share your journal with the world!

Choose Your Publishing Company Name

- > When you have your own ISBN number, you can use your publishing company name as the publisher.
- ➤ Choose a professional sounding name.
- > This can relate to your umbrella topic...
- Or it can simply be a fun name, that sounds professional, that means something to you.
- > Purchase the corresponding domain name.

Get an ISBN Number for Your Book

- ➤ ISBN: International Standard Book Number, is the method by which book sales are tracked by retailers.
 - You add this number to your copyright page.
 - You create a bar code for your back cover, with your ISBN.

- ➤ If you live Outside of the United States: https://www.isbn-international.org/agencies

Independent Versus Free Amazon ISBN Number

- With your own ISBN number (paid in US or free in other countries:
 - $\boldsymbol{-}$ You have the option of publishing to printers other than Amazon.
 - You can use your own publishing company name.
- With KDPs ISBN Amazon's becomes the publisher and they have exclusive rights to sell your book. This can be a problem if you ever go to sell your book on your own site or decide to re-publish with a traditional publisher
 - It will say "Independently Published" on the cover.
 - It will also have Amazon's Independently Published info on your book's page on Amazon.



Final Manuscript Steps

- · Once you've completed the editing and proofing process, note the final page count. You (or your cover designer) need this info to determine the width of the book cover spine.
- · Adjust the spine width of your book cover

You need the final page count for your book before you can:

- -Get a bar code image
- Create a final version of your book cover.

Create the Print Ready Version of Your Book Cover

Gather Assets for Your Book Cover

- Your book cover design which includes your:
 - Book description
 - Author bio excerpt
- Final manuscript page count so you can adjust the spine width
- ISBN bar code

Bar Code Image for Your Back Cover

- You can pay to have your ISBN bar code created.
- Your ISBN company may be able to create one as an image file – so you can add it to PowerPoint or Canva.
- You can have Amazon create it for free during the publication proce
- InDesign users create one for free using a bar code generator:

Finalizing Your Book Cover Design

- Once you have your final page count adjust spine width.
- Once you have your bar code, add it to the back cover.
- Carefully proofread your book cover and save as print-ready PDF.
 - Note for InDesign users: You can access the InDesign Present Files to upload to your InDesign software. You'll find these in the Resources for InDesign section, after module four.
