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to have & to have got

rovnaký význam mať, vlastniť

to have

→ americká angličtina, viac formálne

to have got

→ britská angličtina, menej formálne

TO HAVE

- plnovýznamové sloveso (tak ako iné slovesá, napr. eat, learn, drink, ...)
- použitie vo všetkých časoch



Prítomný čas jednoduchý (present simple)

Prítomný čas priebehový (present simple continuous)

Iba, ak hovoríme o aktivite! Nie vo význame mať, vlastniť! I have a brother. / He <u>has</u> a sister.
I don't have a bother. / He doesn't have a sister.
Do you have a brother? / Does he have a sister?

I am having a shower now. Are they having breakfast?

I **am having** a brother.

TO HAVE



I had a blue car. / He had a green car.
I didn't have a blue car. / He didn't have a green car.
Did you have a blue car? / Did he have a green car?
