School Rules Unit Plans: Life Skills

Lesson 1: School Rules

Learning Objectives:

Students will learn and become familiar with school and classroom rules as well as appropriate behavior.

Materials & Preparation:

- School Rules power point (included)
- Appropriate vs. Not Appropriate T chart pictures (print off each power point slide)
- Pictures for activity (full class and individual- included)
- Glue and scissors

Instruction:

- Ask students if they can tell you school rules they know.
- Explain why rules are important and why we have rules
- Teach the 'School Rules' power point
- Give examples during each slide during the lesson, or ask students for examples if they can think of any.

Full Class Activity:

- Appropriate vs. Not Appropriate T chart
- Draw a T chart on the board, print pictures off and have students take turns putting the picture in the correct column.
- Have students glue the correct picture on their sheet as you do it as a class.

Independent Working Time:

- Comprehension questions (various levels)
- Have students complete the worksheet about the School Rules power point.

Wrap up/Closing:

• Reiterate the importance of school rules. Review the rules again. It would be good to review for the next few days to let it stick ③

Other Ideas for Activities:

- Have students choose 3-5 rules they agree with most and have them draw pictures for each one. Or give each student a rule (depending on how many students you have) to make a poster/sign for.
- Role playing or acting out certain rules with students or other staff in the room.
- Rules Bingo!

Lesson 2: Classroom Rules

Learning Objectives:

Students will become more familiar with school rules and participate in developing rules for their classroom.

Materials & Preparation:

- School Rules Power point (to review school rules)
- White board- print off the picture options so students can help you choose which rules they want for the assignment. (use power point pictures- print 1 slide per page)
- Why do we Have School Rules? Worksheet (various levels included)

Instruction:

- Use power point to review school rules with the class.
- Explain to your students how important rules are and that you are going to write your own classroom rules. The students will help you develop 3-5 rules that they will take part in choosing to follow while they are in your classroom.
- Go to youtube and watch 'Why do Teacher Have Classroom Rules?" at https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ShVwt7LfyWo If this link is no longer working, you can YouTube anything similar.

Full Class Activity:

- Have students help you choose the 5 most important rules they believe should be part of YOUR classroom rules. Guide them in the right direction of course (2) of what you expect from them in class.
 - When students are part of developing something, they take more ownership over it. This also helps students feel like this is their classroom too.
 - You can print the pictures from lesson 1 to use as a visual reference
- Depending on your learners, you can either open power point and create slides for each rule and add pictures the students choose OR have them

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create posters (1 per sheet), write the rules and decorate or draw pictures for each rule.

• Have the students sign (or stamp, dab) their name saying they are going to try to follow these rules. A fun way to have them take ownership!

Independent Working Time:

- Why do we Have School Rules worksheet
- Have students complete the worksheet at their level (or offer addition adult support if needed)

Wrap up/Closing:


• Review the classroom rules with your class.
