




Hands on at Home Cardboard Stencils

You will need:

Paper






Cardboard from a box Drawing material Scissors/Stanley knife






Method:

- 1. Cut some shapes or patterns out of some cardboard to make a stencil
- 2. Place the cardboard on some paper and show your child how to draw inside the stencil to make some fun pictures
- 3. Younger toddlers may find it easier to finger paint inside the stencils

Hands on at Home Animal Walks


You will need:


2 or 4 boxes (tissue boxes work best) Scissors Decorating material (paint, paper, glue or crayons etc)




Method:

- 1. Cut out holes in your boxes for your child's hands and feet to fit inside make sure they are not too big so they don't fall off
- 2. Decorate your boxes to look like different animals
- 3. Show your child how to put his/her hands and feet inside the boxes and walk around like different animals
















Hands on at Home Painting with Toilet Rolls

You will need:



Toilet rolls Tray





Method:

- 1. Fold some toilet rolls into different shapes
- 2. Put some paint on a tray
- 3. Show your child how to dip the toilet roll into the paint and then stamp on your paper

Method:

- 1. Cut a square hole into one side of a large box
- 2. Draw some buttons on the TV and decorate it together
