Different types of families and how they grow

BUILDING WORLD CITIZENS LESSON



World citizens recognize that families grow in many different ways so they can understand that not every family is the same.



Introduction: Pass out copies of the mini-book as you <u>SAY THIS</u>: "Today we are going to look at the story, "Isaac Gets a Family" again. This time, we are going to think like world citizens as we read. I want you to think about Isaac's family and how it was created. As citizens of this world, it's important for us to notice and appreciate just how different each family is. Not every family starts the same or looks the same, but every family is just as important as the rest. Let's read and think about how families are different.

Page 1:

- As you read the first page, stop and share how Isaac's family was the first 7 years of his life.
- Explain that some kids are orphans because their biological parents were not able to care for them.
- Show the first section of the anchor chart (written in red. write it before the lesson to save time.)

Page 2:

- After reading stop and SAY THIS: "How is Isaac's family about to change forever?"
- Call on students and write a few answers on the class anchor chart about Isaac's family for page 2.
- SAY THIS: "How is Isaac's family different from your own?"
- Write a few answers on the class anchor chart by starting a list under 'different types of families.'

Pages 3-4:

- After reading stop and <u>SAY THIS</u>: "Do you remember when you met your parents? Why? Why not?"
- Have ALL students turn and talk with a partner.
- After a few minutes <u>SAY THIS</u>: "What does Isaac learn about being in a family?"
- Have ALL students turn and talk with a partner and write a few answers on the class anchor chart for pages 3-4.
- SAY THIS: "Isaac's family grew through adoption.
 Let's think about all the different types of families and how they grow.
- Have ALL students turn and talk with a partner and add to the list of 'different types of families' on the class anchor chart. ** the list can include families grow and how they look different.




Inferring Character feelings 🗻

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Mini Lesson Statement:

Readers make inferences about how characters feel so they can gain empathy for people in different situations than their own.





<u>Introduction</u>: Pass out copies of the mini-book as you <u>SAY THIS</u>: "The story we are going to read together is called "Isaac Gets a Family." It's about a boy named Isaac who lived for 7 years in an orphanage until he was finally adopted. We are going to make inferences about how Isaac might be feeling on each page of the story! As I read the text to you, I am going to stop and share my inferences about how I think Isaac is feeling. I will stop and ask you to share your inferences as well. Let's get started!"

Page 1:

- As you read the first page, stop and share an inference you have about how Isaac might be feeling.
- Share your inference out loud, as well as a way you can empathize with something in Isaac's shoes.
- Write both your thought

<u>Page 2</u>:

- After reading stop and SAMTH) " repme to go you call her court how Isaac is feeling here?"
- Call on students and write strents of the class of the
- SAY THIS: "How have you developed empathy for kids like Isaac who learn about their family this way?"
- Write a few students answers on the class anchor chart.

<u>Pages 3-4</u>:

- After reading stop and <u>SAY THIS</u>: "What are some things you can infer about how Isaac felt?"
- Have ALL students turn and talk with a partner and write a few answers on the class anchor chart.
- <u>SAY THIS</u>: "How have you developed empathy for what is might be like to wait that long for a family?"

After the lesson:

Use the student page for independent practice or one of the other follow-up activities provided to continue learning. Use the "I Can" table cards for re-teaching in small groups.




