
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


- White square tile measuring 4x4 inches (10x10cm) prepared with Isometric grid MARKED IN PENCIL and circular watercolor (see next page). I use hotpressed watercolor paper. This project involves ultra tiny tangling; if you prefer to make it larger, use 5x5 or larger square paper tiles.
- · Black inking pen. I use Sakura Micron 01.
- Contrasting color fine-liner. I use Sakura Micron Rose 01. You can choose any color you like as long as it is not too dark.
- White gel pen. I use Sakura Gelly Roll 10.
- White charcoal or pastel. I use General's White Charcoal.
- Graphite pencil. I use Staedtler Mars Lumograph F.
- · White colored pencil. I use white Prismacolor Premier.
- · Black colored pencil. I use Cretacolor Nero Extrahard, or Polychromos or Verithin.
- Colored pencil matching the color of the colored fine-liner. I use Caran D'ache Pablo Purplish Red 666.350. Choose a slightly darker color than the fine-liner.
- Practice paper or journal
- Plastic ruler, preferably transparent.
- Zentangle's Markus Operandus Zendala template. <u>Download and print yours here</u>.
- Watercolor paints: black and magenta. I use Ecoline liquid watercolors and black ink.
- Waterbrush or paintbrush with water container.


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
1. Mark 3 lines with Markus Operandus.



3. Paint corners with super dark or black watercolors.



5. Blend with water and magent watercolors.



2. Use ruler to create isometric grid.



4. Add burgundy watercolors in a circle.



6. Blend more with water in circular motion.
