## Painting With Gouache

## Materials:

Paints:
I use Royal Talens Gouache, there are sets of 8 available that are great to start with.

In addition to the colors included in those sets I also sometimes use
1.) Naples Yellow
2.) Turquoise Green
3.) Lilac
4.) Deep yellow
5.) I recommend having an extra tube of white available.

The 8 tube set includes
1.) White
2.) Lemon yellow
3.) Yellow
4.) Ultramarine deep
4.) Light blue cyan
6.) Black intenso
7.) Vermillion
8.) Permanent rose magenta

## Brushes:

The size of brushes depends somewhat on the size of paper you plan to use.
I paint gouache with watercolor brushes
I typically use a round \#8
A Black Velvet oval brush 3/4"
1 or 2 small rounds such as a \# 1,2 or 0
You may also like to use $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ flat
*If you only want to use 1 brush, you can paint most anything with just a \#8 round

If you plan to work on a 22 " x 30 " full wc sheet you may want to also use a 1" flat watercolor brush

## Paper:

I use cotton rag watercolor paper, 140lb or 300 gsm and 90 lb or 185 gsm cold press is great. Rembrandt makes a nice paper block that is a combination of hot press and cold press that is very nice to work on as it's slightly smoother than traditional cold press paper.

I work in a variety of sizes from 6 " x 8 " up to $22 " \times 30$ ". The demonstrations for this class will be on 9" x 12"
You don't need particularly thick paper as it's less likely to buckle because with gouache you use less water than with watercolor.

You'll also need:

Some paper towels
A cup for water
A \#2 pencil or lead holder
A white plastic eraser
