COURSE MATERIALS:

- A set of watercolour tube paints (need to have.) eg Reeves
- A set of watercolour dry pan palettes (not required but nice to have)
- \bullet Watercolour paper at A4 size (two pads) in either cold pressed rough texture or hot pressed smooth 185 or $300\,\mathrm{g\,sm}$.
- Brushes: One round (6 or 8 size), filbert and bright brush. As well as a larger filbert brush for a larger piece.
- Optional: a specific 'wash brush' (but a filbert brush can be used instead.)
- Gold leaf sheets. (Imitation is fine for our purpose.)

• Basic craft glue



COURSE MATERIALS:

- Sea Salt
- Iridescent Medium (I use Winsor and Newton but other brands are fine.)
- A 4B pencil and a basic mechanical (pacer) pencil.

Not mentioned in the video but definitely needed:

• Gold Size Glue (sometimes called Gold Guilding Glue or Japan Gold Size).

- A 'Japan brush' for gold foil.
