My belief is that learning Gen AI for use in your role or business is not an event, but rather a process. Best results in compressing your learning curve will come from immersion in the topic.

The results they got are very telling, and I regularly reference them when explaining the value of implementing Gen AI. If you need to convince the higher ups or your clients to start getting serious about AI, bringing data like this to the conversation makes a strong point in favor.

**2. Ethan Mollick** (Wharton MBA Professor) was part of the study, and has one of the most approachable ways of viewing the use of Gen AI in business. Here he shares his analysis of the BCG experiment I referenced in the above:

His book, [Co-Intelligence: Living and Working with AI](#), was released in April 2024 and is a great primer for a broader understanding of Gen AI and the impact it is having on businesses. This book is intended for non-technical business professionals, so it is super easy to digest and there is no need for an understanding of Data Science or Machine Learning to get tons of value from it.

In his book he outlines four essential rules for integrating AI into work and life, and I think they are a great baseline for anyone new to using the tools:

- **Always Invite AI to the Table**

Regularly incorporate AI into your decision-making processes (aka start “thinking in AI”).

- **Be the Human in the Loop**

Use AI to handle tasks it excels at while you focus on human-centric activities like strategic thinking and creativity. You’ll do way less fire fighting in your day to day.

- **Treat AI Like a Person, But Define Its Role**

Communicate with AI as you would with a human colleague, clearly defining its role to optimize its performance. The persona method prompting pattern in the video is a perfect solution.

- **Assume This is the Worst AI You’ll Ever Use**

By the time you finish reading this sentence, “AI” is better than when I started writing this sentence. It improves constantly and at high velocity. The tools you use will constantly be releasing new capabilities so it’s important someone on your team is regularly

using the tools in your AI tool stack, and taking trainings like this to know what's happening. Being the person in the know on AI in your business will only bring good things and big opportunities.
