Now that we've made a number of triangle templates, it's time to practice using them in a project. Part two of the homework is simple and contains two parts. One, you need to practice customizing them and two, you need to use those customized templates in a project.

Now let's go over the guidelines for this homework. The first guideline is to use at least two of the triangle templates in a project. Second, use any of the four triangle templates that you wish. And third, remember to revisit the customization rules from section one of this class. The rules for customizing a paper strip are the exact same as they are for triangles.

Now let's take a look at the triangle templates I decided to use and how I customized them. As you can see, I used coordinating colors and just a touch of pattern. I also made sure to use a matching font on both. Here's the scrapbook page I made using my two customized templates. I used my two triangles to help tell my story and I also placed them so that they would point towards the main photo.
