

- Covenant a binding agreement that constitutes God and the Hebrews as family, "I will be your God, you will be my people."
- A progression: Noah, Abraham, Moses, David: promise of Messiah.

# Christianity

- ✦ A world religion - 2.1 billion members
- ✦ Split from Judaism around 2,000 years ago
- ✦ Based on belief that Jesus of Nazareth, who had been crucified, was risen from the dead
- ✦ Communities, teachings and practices of the followers of Jesus -- Christians.

## A New Covenant

- ✦ Fulfillment of Jewish covenantal development.
- ✦ Jesus establishes a new relationship between humanity and God.
- ✦ This new relationship is claimed through faith, not through adherence to the Jewish Law.
- ✦ Initiation into the community of believers is through Baptism.
- ✦ Eucharist as the ritualized remembrance of the sacrifice of Christ.

# Community

# Sacramental

- ✦ Sign that communicates grace
- ✦ Church as first Sacrament of Christ's presence



- ✦ Sacramentals - signs and symbols that facilitate connection
- ✦ Sacraments - touch-points with Christ's life; consecrates, heals, nourishes.



# Cosmic Presence



- ✦ God creates through the Word
- ✦ All creation has connection with God through the Word.
- ✦ Jesus is the Incarnate Word and is present to all creation.
- ✦ Creation as "iconic"

**Spirituality** - the process of developing the life of the human spirit in its openness to ultimate meaning, truth, and goodness.

**Christian Faith** - openness to and entrusting belief in the providential care and guidance of God as revealed and mediated through the Person of Jesus Christ.

**Christian Spirituality** - spiritual development in the context of Christian faith.  
- explicit reference to Jesus Christ  
- intentional practices to cultivate relationship with Jesus through the modes of his presence to us
