- 1 full sheet of 300lb CP Arches watercolor paper, torn in half for 2 (15"x22") paintings (Lesson 1 (Gloria Shirley) ½ sheet (15"x 22") 300lb Arches watercolor paper) (Lesson 2 (Rhodo Bud) (15"x 22") 300lb Arches watercolor paper)
- ½ sheet of 140lb CP Arches watercolor paper (or scrap) for testing color blends
- Large 1-gallon plastic rinse wash bucket (or large Tupperware container)
- Palette covered plastic pallet with shallow wells (I like a Richeson palette, you can find it in my Kit above)
- Paper towels (any kind)
- Removable Masking fluid or drawing gum
- Old terry cloth
- Notebook
- Pencil (2HB is fine)
- Kneaded eraser
- Small mist spray bottle
- Rubber pick-up eraser

Mr. Clean Eraser optional (available in the cleaning section of the grocery store) **About color:** whenever possible use professional quality transparent watercolors they have a higher pigment load, less filler and are ground finer giving you the best results.

Paper: For the actual paintings, I prefer one 22"x30" (full sheet) of 300lb Arches watercolor paper torn to 15"x22" size. Pad paper reacts differently and student brands will not give you the results you want.

Brushes: before investing into expensive brushes, or ones that don't work as well, consider the ones I use. These are available in my workshops and on my website http://shop.birgitoconnor.com/t/brushes

Hake Brush: these have a tendency to loose hair, an easy fix is to squirt a little "Super glue liquid" along the edge of the handle and work it in.

Test the masking fluid

• If the masking fluid has a color it may stain the paper, so before using, test it first on a scrap piece of paper
